Dr. Lewis Brogdon nominated to be Interim Pastor



The Interim Pastor Search Team has unanimously recommended Dr. Lewis Brogdon to be Interim Pastor of Crescent Hill Baptist Church. **He will preach in view of a call on Sunday, February 1, and a vote of the congregation will occur at the close of worship. If elected, he will begin his duties immediately.**

Dr. Brogdon is a pastor, teacher, and ministry leader whose work brings together thoughtful preaching, practical discipleship, and a steady commitment to faith. He often describes his roots simply: he was formed by the church, shaped by family, and guided over time into a calling that blends pastoral care with public witness.

His ministry spans multiple church traditions and settings, including rural and city congregations and both predominantly Black and predominantly White communities. Across those experiences, he has leaned into building trust, strengthening congregational life, and helping communities move forward with clarity and hope.

Professionally, beginning in 2026, Dr. Brogdon will serve as Executive Director of JustFaith Ministries in Louisville. He previously served as Executive Director of the Institute for Black Church Studies and Associate Professor at BSK Theological Seminary in Lexington.

Dr. Brogdon's educational background includes a B.A. in Christian Studies and Sociology, an M.Div. in New Testament Studies, and a Ph.D. in Theology. He is a frequent speaker and lecturer and has written widely on preaching, the spiritual life of the church, and Christian witness in times of social strain.

At heart, Dr. Brogdon's pastoral focus is simple: preaching that meets people where they are, leadership that listens before it leads, and a vision of the gospel that forms a congregation's life together—week by week, decision by decision, and neighbor by neighbor.

This interim season is planned for one year and may be extended by mutual agreement between the church and Dr. Brogdon. If a permanent pastor is called during this time, the interim period will conclude early.

Today's Worship Leaders

Jason Crosby is beginning his fourth year as Chaplain at Centre College, his and Kate's alma mater. He serves on the Crusade for Children and Kentucky Refugee Ministries Boards of Directors. He also spends an extraordinary amount of time driving Brooks, Millie Lou, and friends to school and extracurricular activities.

Brooks Crosby is in ninth grade at DuPont Manual High School where he is currently running for the varsity cross country team. He is excited about his 15th birthday on October 10 because he will soon thereafter secure his driving permit. Even when not running you are still likely to find Brooks outside swimming in the summer or skiing in the winter.

Millie Lou Crosby is in seventh grade at Noe Middle School. Like her brother she runs cross country for the Noe girls team, the defending state champions. Additionally, Millie Lou plays guitar in the Noe Jazz Band and in Mint, a band comprised of her peers who primarily cover 80s and 90s rock songs. She also is a very talented visual artist.

Michael Smith has been a member of CHBC since 2018. He grew up in Elizabeth, IN. Michael received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Bellarmine University with a major in theology and a minors in music and psychology. He completed a Master of Divinity degree from Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary. CHBC ordained him to the Gospel ministry on October 31, 2021. Michael completed a residency in Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) with Norton Hospital and now serves as a chaplain at Kentucky State Reformatory in LaGrange, KY. Michael loves singing, cooking, and reading in his spare time.

If you have a completed Advent coloring you would like the Art Spirit group to display, please place it in the Art Spirit mailbox with a yellow label located in the Church Office.




